MXI Expands Abingdon Recycling Capacity

- Ethanol Production Capacity Increased by 200% to 3 Million Gallons
- Water Treatment Plant Eliminates Discharge

Abingdon, VA - MXI Environmental Services, LLC today announced that it has expanded ethanol recovery and production capabilities at its Abingdon, VA facility. This expansion allows MXI to increase the volume of non-hazardous byproducts that it can manage for customers. These byproducts include ethanol solutions from industrial and consumer goods production facilities and alcoholic beverage waste. MXI will now be able to produce up to 3 million gallons per year of ethanol, a 200% increase from its prior capacity of 1 million gallons. In addition to two new distillation columns, MXI has also installed a water recycling plant. The recovered ethanol is a renewable fuel that can be used to replace or supplement gasoline.

MXI's expansion creates an environmentally sound use for byproducts from the beer, wine, spirits, cosmetics, consumer product and pharmaceutical industries. MXI's facility recycles all solids and liquids, and it treats and reuses all residual water onsite. "This expansion demonstrates MXI's commitment to conservation and production of alternative fuels. This expansion makes our ethanol recycling facility among the greenest on the planet," explained Ron Potter, chief executive officer and founder of MXI. "Converting discarded products into ethanol provides our customers a cost-effective alternative to disposal while creating a renewable fuel, jobs and a favorable environmental impact."

The operation will receive consumer packaged, or "case" goods and bulk liquids. Case goods are processed in equipment that captures the liquids and recycles the packaging. Liquids are transferred to the ethanol recovery facility, where the ethanol is distilled to product specifications and the water is recycled. The ethanol product is tested and then sold into the fuel market.

"Traditional ethanol plants in the United States use corn to make ethanol. We are expanding our ability to convert waste into value. Our process benefits generators and ethanol users who seek environmentally efficient solutions to their needs," says Brian

Potter, VP Operations of the Abingdon, VA facility. “Clients are always interested in conveniently located regional facilities for their waste and product requirements. Southwest Virginia is an attractive location with easy access to large markets”.
