CUSTOMER RESPONSE TO IMPROVE WITH MXI SYSTEMS UPGRADES

Langhorne, PA – Maumee Express, Inc. (MXI), a waste transportation and environmental services company with facilities in Langhorne PA, Abingdon VA, Sumter SC, Marvern AR and Fontana, CA has announced upgrades to its fleet control system. The company is installing the Prophecy suite of program to enhance reporting of its fleet activities. Prophecy will operate in conjunction with Qualcomm wireless communication units that are in each truck. All MXI trucks from each of the terminals will be tied together by this new system.

Increased reporting will benefit MXI's customers directly. "Having the Prophecy and Qualcomm units on our trucks allows MXI dispatchers to plan more effectively and communicate proactively with both our drivers and our customers," says Tony Schiliro, MXI's vice president of sales. "That improves the productivity of our fleet. No one is waiting around for the trucks. Our customers have the correct information at the push of a key."

Prophecy is the largest supplier of trucking software to fleets of MXI's size. The new system has met with enthusiastic support from MXI's dispatchers and drivers. "The drivers like this system. They like the fact that all dispatches are communicated directly to the Qualcomm unit in their truck. They don't have to call in all the time," says Dave Trent, MXI dispatcher. "And what I like about it is that we tie in the payroll and billing directly. There is a great cross check between what the driver does and what the customer is paying our company to do."

MXI also announced it is adding additional equipment to its fleet to serve its growing customer base. In addition to expanding the number of van trailers, MXI is also expanding its vacuum tankers and roll-off fleets. "We are focusing our equipment expansion to assure that our company can satisfy all of our customer needs" said Ron Potter, President of MXI.

MXI has been in business since 1960 when founder C.G. Potter started a small trucking operation out of the Erie Railroad ramp in Jersey City, NJ. He named the company Maumee Express after his hometown of Maumee, OH. Today the company has two divisions, Maumee Express, which

handles hazardous and nonhazardous waste trucking, and MXI Environmental Services, which offers waste recycling, remediation and disposal services. The company is permitted for waste transport in 42 states and serves a nationwide customer base from its facilities in Langhorne, PA, Abingdon, VA, Sumter, SC and Fontana, CA. MXI also operates waste transfer stations at Piscataway (hazardous waste), Abingdon (hazardous and solid waste) Sumter SC (hazardous waste) and Fontana (hazardous waste).
