### **MATERIALS RECOVER FACILITY EXPANDS PROCESSING CAPABILITY**

*Abingdon, VA* – MXI Environmental Services (MXI), a waste transportation and environmental services company, is pleased to announce the expansion of its Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) at 26319 Old Trail Road (State Road 879), Abingdon, VA. The facility has added a MacSaturn 52” by 32” HT Shear Shredder secured from Unlimited Resources Corporation. This High Torque shredder expands the capable of the facility to include non-processable materials and disfiguring of various drum or cartons, or palletized loads. The shredded materials are completely homogenous after being processed.

“Expanding the facility with the addition of this shredder further expands our commitment to providing our customers with a single source for waste transportation and disposal,” says Ron Potter, MXI’s president. “Our customers have asked for shredding capacity and appreciate that we have committed to it.” MXI transports waste, including less than truckload quantities, from customer facilities on MXI-owned trucks and brings it to the Abingdon facility.

The facility can process a variety of wastes, including

- Spent carbon
- Contaminated absorbent
- Household hazardous waste
- Non-RCRA fertilizers & pesticides
- Contaminated soils and sands
- Still bottoms
- Water treatment chemicals
- Wastewaters

“We take title to the waste once we receive it and the customer’s obligation stops,” says Scott Shaw, the MRF manager. “Many other firms can’t offer this. We work with generators to profile the waste and then we prepare all the documentation and provide certificates of disposal. With the Shredder, we can handle a whole new range of materials”

Treatment and disposal methods vary, depending on the type of waste. The MXI facility also has state-of-the-art containment to prevent release of materials into the environment.

MXI has been in business since 1960 when founder C.G. Potter started a small trucking operation out of the Erie Railroad ramp in Jersey City, NJ. He named the company Maumee Express after his hometown of Maumee, OH. Today the company has two divisions, Maumee Express, which handles hazardous and non-hazardous waste trucking, and MXI Environmental Services, which offers waste recycling, remediation and disposal services. The company is permitted for waste transport in 42 states and serves a nationwide customer base from its facilities in Abingdon, VA, Piscataway, NJ, Sumter, SC and Fontana, CA. MXI also operates waste transfer stations at Piscataway (hazardous waste), Abingdon (hazardous and solid waste) Sumter (hazardous waste) and Fontana (hazardous waste).
