**CUSTOMER PRODUCTIVITY TO IMPROVE WITH MXI FLEET UPGRADES**

*Abingdon, VA* – Maumee Express, Inc. (MXI), a waste transportation and environmental services company with facilities in Abingdon, has announced upgrades to its fleet. The company is installing the Qualcomm wireless communication technology in each of its trucks. All MXI trucks based in Virginia, South Carolina, and New Jersey will have the units on board.

Installing mobile messaging benefits MXI's customers directly. "Having the Qualcomm units on our trucks allows MXI dispatchers to communicate accurate arrival and departure times to our customers," says Tony Schiliro, MXI's vice president of sales. "That improves our customers' productivity because they know when to be ready for our trucks. Their people don't stand around waiting."

The Qualcomm network, with geographic coverage across the US and Canada, uses satellites to track vehicle locations and send messages to and from drivers. The mobile messaging technology has met with enthusiastic response from MXI's dispatchers and drivers. "The drivers think it's the greatest thing. They like it that they don't have to call in that much for check calls," says Dave Trent, MXI dispatcher. "And what I like about it is that I can see where all the trucks are. I can see if they're a couple hours out and then I can call the customer and let them know."

MXI also announced it is adding new equipment to its fleet to serve its growing customer base. The company is also expanding its vacuum tankers and roll-offs.

Separately, MXI recently purchased a terminal facility in Bristol PA that has office, dock and maintenance facilities. The total site covers 4 ½ acres and represents a private investment of 1 million dollars. The facility will employ approximately 20 people when fully operational.

MXI has been in business since 1960 when founder C.G. Potter started a small trucking operation out of the Erie Railroad ramp in Jersey City, NJ. He named the company Maumee Express after his hometown of Maumee, OH. Today the company has two divisions, Maumee Express, which handles hazardous and nonhazardous waste trucking, and MXI Environmental Services, which offers waste recycling, remediation and disposal services. The company is permitted for waste transport in 42 states and serves a nationwide customer base from its facilities in Abingdon, VA, Piscataway, NJ, Sumter, SC and Fontana, CA. MXI also operates waste transfer stations at Piscataway (hazardous waste), Abingdon (hazardous and solid waste) Sumter SC (hazardous waste) and Fontana (hazardous waste).
